## Alvarinho

Fruity aromas and tempting floral notes. The combination of the aromas and a palate highlighted by crisp acidity and flavorful minerality make this Alvarinho a classic example of the variety.



## Red Blend

The wine is unoaked and the nose shows red fruit notes, red berries and cherries with ripe fruit flavors on the palate. Excellent structure. A velvety, round and well-balanced wine.



## Touriga Nacional

Made solely from Portugal's most famous grape varietal, which expresses its great character and deep black currant flavor. Excellent structure, round and perfectly balanced wine. Persistent with a long finish.

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# DELAFORCE PORT

Delaforce's history in the Douro Valley dates back nearly 200 years when the family arrived from England in 1834 and eventually founded the Delaforce Port firm in 1868. Between 1894 and 1906, George Delaforce had a warrant to supply Port wine to the Portuguese Royal Household, a rare honor for a non-Portuguese citizen. The company still uses the royal coat of arms on the label.

Almost every port style is represented in the Delaforce range of wines which are sold throughout the world. Over the years, Delaforce has developed a reputation for its outstanding blending and aging skills which express themselves in the company's renowned aged tawny ports. Its distinguished portfolio of products continues to earn the company its recognition as the master of the port blend.

# Port Collection

Over 30 classic Douro grape varieties can be used to make Port but only a handful of the best are planted at the Delaforce vineyards, each contributing to the blend with their unique character and flavor. These include the Touriga Franca, Touriga Nacional and Tinta Roriz.



## Fine White Porto

The crisp, clean presentation in green and cream conveys modernity and reflects its versatility as a cool aperitif or sweet dessert wine. Pale color and medium sweetness. Pleasantly fruity bouquet, typical of Port, which maintains its pale color over a long period.



## Rosé Port

Pink in color with floral notes and raspberry aromas on the nose. On the palate are notes of ripe cherry and berry fruit flavors with an attractive touch of honey and grapefruit. Fresh and crisp finish.



## Fine Ruby Porto

This Fine Ruby port has a bouquet that is fruity and full, and in the glass, it shows its deep ruby color. Smooth and satisfying, with an average age of three years.



## Fine Tawny Porto

An attractive, young Tawny Port that is lighter in color and style than the Fine Ruby, while maintaining a good richness of flavor on the palate. It shows good maturity and character.



## 10 Year Old Tawny Porto

The classic 10 Year Old Tawny is a blend of selected reserves aged from six to thirty years old which give "His Eminence's Choice" the elegant richness, mellowness and consistency for which it is renowned.



## 20 Year Old Tawny Porto

This finest Tawny is both very special and old. A limited selection has been made of Ports from our oldest reserves that have been maturing in cask for an average of twenty years or more. Over this time, "Curious & Ancient" has developed a unique character and a rich tawny brown color that perfectly reflects the depth of quality of the best Douro vineyards.



## Late Bottled Vintage Porto

Delaforce LBVs are bottled after maturing in wood for up to six years, offering an early softness and development. As these Ports are only made available in those years when the harvest has been very good, they constantly produce a mature port of vintage quality and are ready for drinking without requiring decanting.



## Vintage Porto

Vintage Ports are made and declared only in years of exceptional climatic and quality conditions. After bottling, they mature slowly for many years to gain the unforgettable richness that places them among the world's greatest wines.
